Founded in 2023, the mission of the Shulgin Foundation is to steward the Shulgin legacy and secure their historic property, the Shulgin Farm, as a living nexus for educational opportunities, social connections, and critical conversations.

The Farm

Shulgin Farm, nestled in the golden hills of Lafayette, California, is the site of the 200-square-foot chemistry lab that helped birth the synthetic psychedelic movement.

The impact of this place goes beyond the singular compounds that first came into being in Sasha's lab. It lives and expands in the communities that continue to flourish here — composed of brilliant minds and compassionate souls who share their ideas in service of understanding, healing, and ultimately our love for one another.

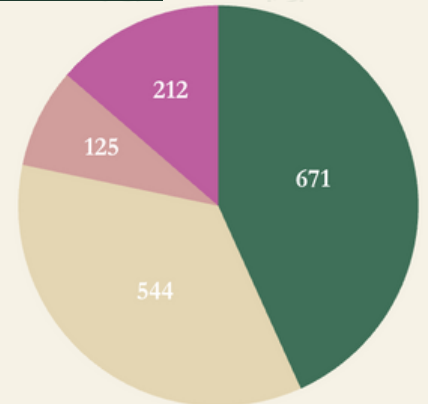

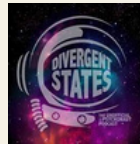

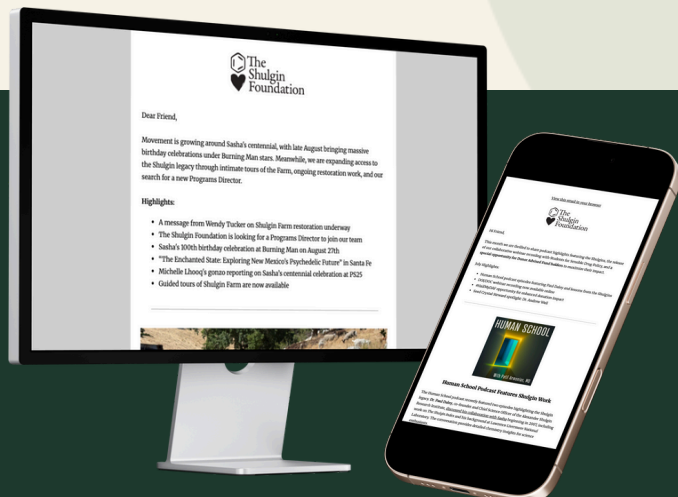

Programs and Initiative Impact

Looking back on 2025, the Foundation was focused on work days, and property improvements, and small community gatherings. In 2025, our programs advanced the vision of Shulgin Farm as a permanent historic home for the psychedelic movement and a hub for inspiration, education, and community. **We more than doubled on-site participation and significantly expanded our reach and programming.**

Legacy & Oral Histories

We hosted several events that aimed to preserve psychedelic history and document community voices, including:

- Reddit “Ask Me Anything” with Wendy Tucker *(February)*
- Oral Histories of the Psychedelic Underground with Maria Mangini & Adele Getty *(September)*
- Better Living Through Chemistry Film Screening *(December)*



Psychedelic Science & Education

Our educational offerings served as hubs for scientific curiosity and thoughtful dialogue, including:

- Workshops on psilocybin mushrooms, cacti grafting, and plant alkaloid extraction with Dr. Paul Daley and Boyan Xu *(February & April)*
- Sasha Shulgin's Last Stand: Exploring a Luminary's Final Compounds and Separation, Purification and Analysis of Psychoactive Substances with Dr. Paul Daley *(June)*
- Octopuses on Ecstasy and the Future of Psychedelics with Dr. Gül Dölen and Joe Dolce *(September)*

We curated experiential gatherings designed to bring the community together in music and learning, with emphasis on ways to prepare for and integrate psychedelic experiences, including:

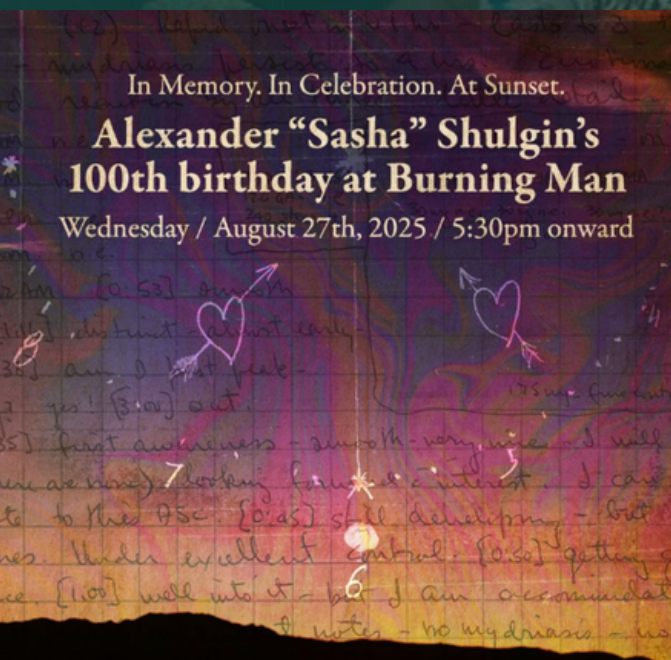

Impact Stories

In 2025, the Shulgin Foundation transformed from steward of history into catalyst for connection. **We brought together generations of researchers, honoring forgotten pioneers, and creating spaces where science and wisdom could flourish side by side.**

Bridging the Gap Between Eras

Our Psychedelic Science 2025 panel, “The Shulgin Legacy: From MDMA to Modern Medicine,” filled a room of over 250 people. Former Lykos CEO Amy Emerson highlighted how the Shulgins’ blend of rigorous chemistry and careful attention to subjective experience still offers a model for modern research. Dr. Mariavittoria Mangini spoke to the enduring relevance of Ann’s therapeutic insights as these methods scale.

What happened after the formal discussion was equally significant. The speakers lingered, embraced on stage, and stayed long after to answer questions and connect. The atmosphere echoed the Friday night dinners at the Farm, where chemists, therapists, and artists freely shared ideas across disciplines.

Why it Matters As psychedelic medicine grows more fragmented, the Foundation is actively rebuilding spaces for cross-generational, cross-disciplinary dialogue that the field urgently needs.

Synthesizing the Next Generation

The Foundation expanded educational access throughout 2025, with online chemistry courses, policy-focused webinars with Students for Sensible Drug Policy, and rapid response programming during the DEA’s attempt to schedule DOI and DOC, including “You’ve Gotta Fight for Your Right to Research (Chemicals)” with Hamilton Morris, Robert Rush, and Dr. Alaina Jaster.

At the Farm, intimate workshops, from mycology to “The Chemistry of Joy,” embodied the Shulgin ethos, pairing rigorous science with human sensitivity.

Why it Matters The Foundation is not just preserving knowledge. We are actively transmitting methodologies, ethics, and community spirit to researchers, therapists, and advocates who will shape psychedelic medicine's future.

Impact Stories

Restoring a Sacred Center

Throughout 2025, the Foundation undertook significant restoration work at the Farm. Goats handled fire abatement. Trees were trimmed. The house received its first paint in years, keeping the original colors to maintain authenticity. Mark Martini stayed on site doing extensive gardening, with plans to build out an ethnobotanical garden that tells the history of each plant and how it arrived there.

"We're trying to keep everything as original as possible as we do repairs and improvements," explained Wendy Tucker. But preservation here means something more than museum curation. New guided tours now welcome visitors into the space where psychedelic history was made. Workshops on cactus grafting, alkaloid extraction, and tryptamine chemistry bring the laboratory back to life.

Why it Matters The Farm's restoration ensures that future generations can experience the physical space where Ann and Sasha did their work as a living center for education, research, and community gathering.

Legal, Scientific, and Cultural Responsibility

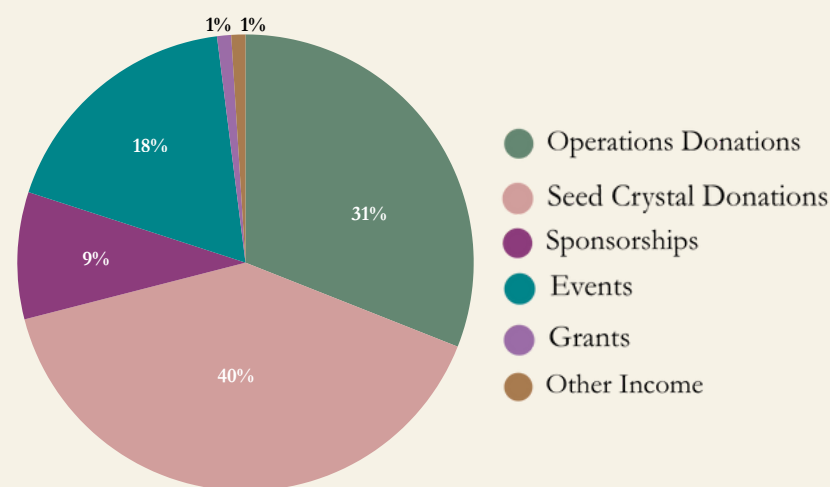
In 2025, the Foundation **implemented a formal Conflict of Interest Policy** to strengthen governance and reinforce accountability at all levels of leadership. In parallel, we began **developing a comprehensive Code of Conduct, scheduled for adoption in January 2026**, to further codify expectations around ethics, safety, inclusion, and compliance. Together, these measures reflect our ongoing commitment to transparency, accountability, and ethical stewardship of the Shulgin legacy.

Revenue by Category

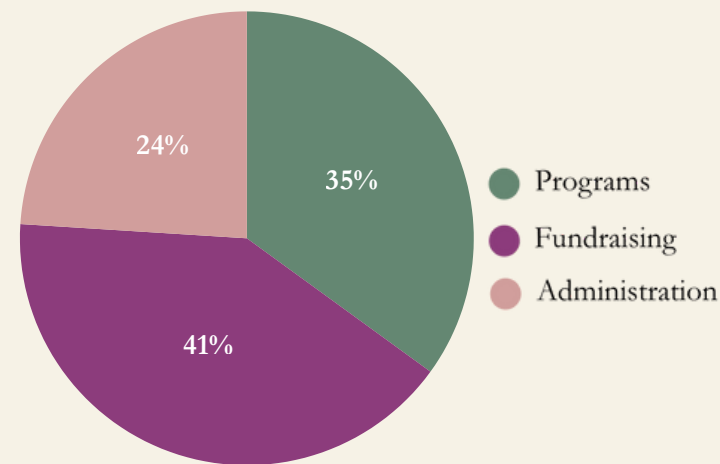

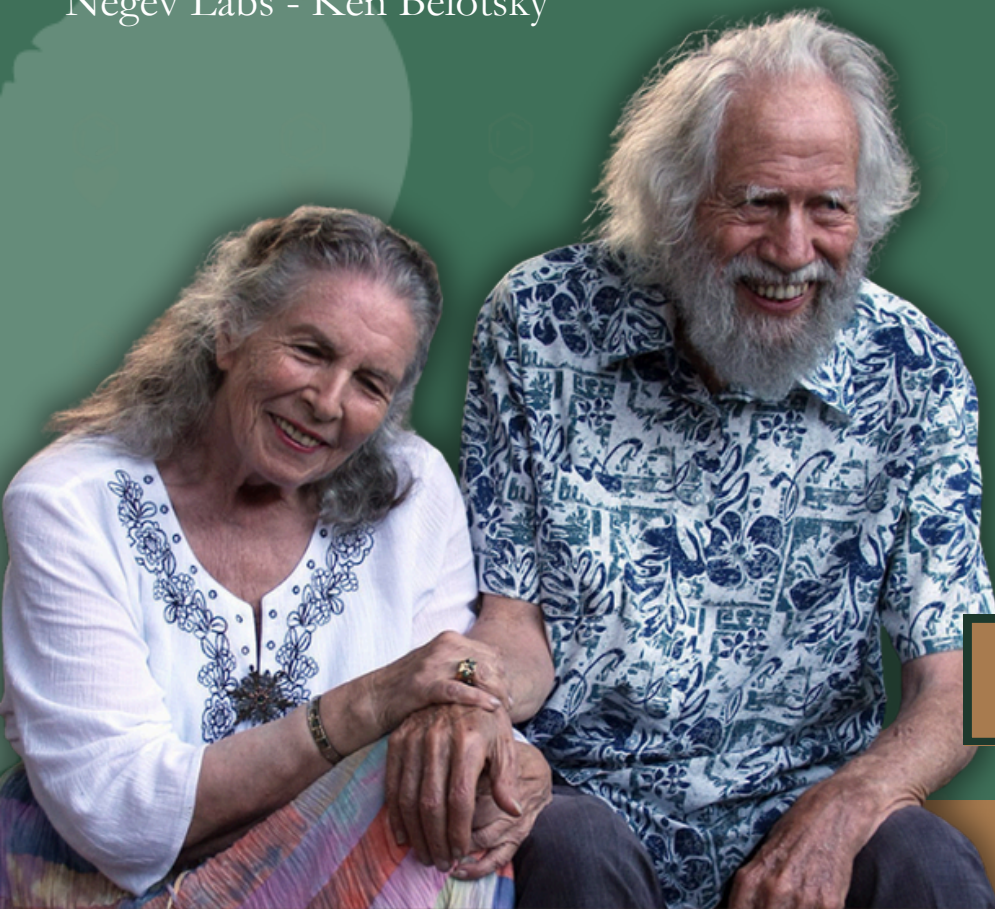

Our programming is evolving to meet the moment, with gatherings, conversations, and change labs designed to hold meaningful—and sometimes challenging—dialogue. The psychedelic field is rich with diverse perspectives, practices, and lineages. While this diversity is a strength, it also brings complexity as the field navigates questions of access, ethics, policy, and integration. Shulgin Farm has long served as a place where people can come together across differences, explore shared questions, and learn in community.

2026 Initiatives and Projects

- 1 2026 marks a major milestone: **the Shulgin Foundation will formally assume stewardship of the historic Shulgin Farm!**
- 2 **We'll be deepening our role as a convener**, hosting Critical Conversations at the Farm. As the field responds to the rapid growth, rising public attention, and evolving regulation of psychedelics entering FDA approved statuses, we will provide a warm and safe space for the hard problems to be discussed, worked on, and developed to support the growth and integration of the field - just as Ann and Sasha always did.
- 3 **Renovations to the Barn** and infrastructure projects to the property will begin in Q3.
- 4 In 2026, we will see a **major expansion of foundational educational programs.**
- 5 In Spring of 2026, we'll be **hosting the opening of our archival exhibit installation in partnership with the Berkeley Center for the Science of Psychedelics**, lifting up Sasha's great work in resynthesizing MDMA and bringing it firmly into the therapeutic world.
